Tribunal Finds Threat of Injury—Oil Country Tubular Goods Originating in or Exported from Nine Countries

Ottawa, Ontario, April 2, 2015

The Canadian International Trade Tribunal (the Tribunal) today found that the dumping of oil country tubular goods, originating in or exported from Chinese Taipei, the Republic of India, the Republic of Indonesia, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, the Kingdom of Thailand, the Republic of Turkey, Ukraine and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam has not caused but is threatening to cause injury to the domestic industry. Anti-dumping duties will therefore be collected by the Canada Border Services Agency. The complainants in this case were Tenaris Canada and Evraz Inc. NA Canada.

The Tribunal will issue the reasons for its finding on April 17, 2015.

The Tribunal is an independent quasi-judicial body that reports to Parliament through the Minister of Finance. It hears cases on dumped and subsidized imports, safeguard complaints, complaints about federal government procurement and appeals of customs and excise tax rulings. When requested by the federal government, the Tribunal also provides advice on other economic, trade and tariff matters.
