Bulgaria became an EU member State on 1 January 2007. As of this date, previously taken national actions ceased to apply, and were replaced by EU-wide actions. Because EU notifies actions on behalf of its member States, the numbers for the EU are not additionally reported in this row.

⁵ Czech Republic, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Slovenia
Czech Republic, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and Slovenia became EU member States on 1 May 2004. As of this date, previously taken national actions ceased to apply, and were replaced by EU-wide actions. Because EU notifies actions on behalf of all of its member States, the numbers for the EU are not additionally reported in this row.

⁶European Union

All anti-dumping actions notified by the European Union operate EU-wide, i.e., in respect of all EU member States, which do not notify individually.

⁷Kazakhstan

To avoid multiple-counting, the row for this Member reports numbers with asterisks, as the anti-dumping actions that it notified are the same as those identified in respect of the Russian Federation and at the level of the Customs Union of the Eurasian Economic Community for 2011-2014, and at the level of Eurasian Economic Union from 2015 onwards.

⁸Kyrgyz Republic

To avoid multiple-counting, the row for this Member reports numbers with asterisks. The Kyrgyz Republic became a member State of the Eurasian Economic Union on 12 August 2015. As of this date, dumping actions are the same as those identified in respect of the Russian Federation, and operate at the level of the Eurasian Economic Union.

⁹Russian Federation

All anti-dumping actions identified in respect of the Russian Federation (which became a WTO Member on 22 August 2012) for 2011-2014 operated at the level of the Customs Union of the Eurasian Economic Community, i.e., also in respect of Belarus and Kazakhstan (then non-WTO Members). All actions identified in respect of the Russian Federation for 2015 and thereafter operate at the level of the Eurasian Economic Union, i.e., also in respect of Armenia, Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan (which became a WTO Member on 30 November 2015), and Belarus (non-WTO Member).

¹⁰Saudi Arabia

All anti-dumping actions identified in respect of Saudi Arabia operate at the level of the Gulf Cooperation Council, i.e., also in respect of Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, and United Arab Emirates.

¹¹South Africa

All anti-dumping actions notified by South Africa operate at the level of the Southern African Customs Union, i.e., also in respect of Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Namibia.
