Certain Copper Pipe Fittings 2 Notice of Final Determinations

Ottawa, April 25, 2018

On April 25, 2018, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA), pursuant to paragraph 41(1)(a) of the Special Import Measures Act (SIMA), made final determinations of dumping and subsidizing in respect of certain copper pipe fittings from Vietnam.

The subject goods are usually classified under the following tariff classification numbers:

- 7412.10.00.11
- 7412.10.00.19
- 7412.10.00.90
- 7412.20.00.11
- 7412.20.00.12
- 7412.20.00.19
- 7412.20.00.90

Note that the tariff classification numbers are for convenience of reference only. Refer to the product definition for authoritative details regarding the subject goods.

The Canadian International Trade Tribunal (CITT) is continuing its inquiry into the question of injury to the domestic industry and will make an order or finding by May 25, 2018.

Provisional duties will continue to be applied on imports of dumped and subsidized subject goods from Vietnam until the CITT concludes its inquiry and issues its finding.

NOTE: The margin of dumping reported in the table above is the margin determined by the CBSA for purposes of the final determination of dumping. In the event of an injury finding by the CITT, the dumping duty for future exports of subject goods will be subject to the all exporters anti dumping duty rate pursuant to a ministerial specification.

As reported in the table above, the amount of subsidy (as a percentage of export price) is the amount determined by the CBSA for purposes of the final determination of subsidizing. This amount does not reflect the countervailing duty to be levied on future importations of subsidized goods from Vietnam, which will be based on the specific amount of subsidy, per kilogram, converted into Canadian dollars.
